
Forgive us, Lord, and help our unbelief, so that what we confess with our lips we may truly believe in our hearts.



**NEXT SUNDAY!** We will have **ONE WORSHIP SERVICE** on Sunday, August 20<sup>th</sup> and the


Summer Fair will follow with hotdogs, side dishes, ice cream and watermelon! There will be lots of fun and games for kids of all ages!
