Security

The Session has, for many months, been discussing the topic of security—how we make our church building and grounds as safe as can be for our members and visitors on Sunday mornings. It's a topic that stirs some unease. We hate to think of our church being a place of anything but peace, love, and welcome to all. And yet, we realize we should do all we can to look after each other in the very unlikely event of somebody coming onto the church property with the intent to do physical harm.

After considerable discussion and prayer, the Session has committed to enhancing our security through two measures beginning in August.

First, we have contracted with Solid Ground Security Solutions in Maryville to provide a plain-clothes, armed officer from 8:30-12:30 on Sunday mornings.

Solid Ground was started several years ago by a Maryville police officer (now retired) who sensed a calling to help churches, schools, and businesses maintain and heighten the safety of their facilities. All its officers have been trained in the most up-to-date security procedures and weapons safety (many are retired police officers).

A Solid Ground officer will be at our church in advance of, during, and following both worship services and will observe and keep a watchful eye on the building and grounds throughout the morning, in addition to responding to any security event that may develop. A marked vehicle with the company's name on it will also be visible in the parking lot.

Second, our ushers will be trained to work in tandem with the officer (observing and being aware of people entering and leaving the property) and being in communication should any problems develop.

We know that the prospect of having an armed officer here raises the objections of some. The Session grappled with the wide variety of perspectives we all bring to the table regarding the best ways to increase safety. We respect those who believe weapons of any kind have no place on the church premises.

However, we also believe that it is our obligation to protect as best we can our worshipers here on Sunday mornings. And we trust these added security measures will serve as further deterrents to anyone who would consider doing us harm.

Our church is located in a safe neighborhood, and there have been no threats made to us or anybody in the church. The Session simply believes these actions will increase our safety and, therefore, will enhance our community life and worship on Sunday mornings.



At its meeting on July 22, the Session:

• Discussed potential improvements to the sanctuary and narthex areas in a future Fresh Look II project. Based upon focus group and survey results, areas of emphasis should include improvements to the lights and sound in the sanctuary, the narthex rest rooms, and updated décor throughout. Work with architect Brewer Ingram Fuller on detailed plans will commence in 2025.

• Approved a plan to inform the congregation of church security upgrades, including the hiring of a security company for Sunday mornings. The plan will include announcements in worship, Constant Contact emails, and the Good News Banner.

• Heard of Pastor Matt's calling of a special Session meeting for August 4 at 10 a.m. to welcome new members.
