Holy God, you know us better than we know ourselves. You see our need when we are blind to it.


You have made us to be yours.

In your compassion, forgive us for our lack of faith and the harm we do to others and to your earth.


Forgive us for turning away from your will, for ignoring the cries of our neighbors, for failing to listen to what is most nourishing even for ourselves.
