A Message from our Pastor



Doing Hard Things

The Division of Student Life at the University of Alabama, where my son Jacob goes to college, sends out periodic emails to parents. It will often include articles suggesting ways to encourage their kids to study more or smarter, ways to help them navigate the college curriculum so that they actually graduate in roughly four years, and tips for helping them maintain their mental health.

This week, one of the articles was titled, "From a College Professor: Families, Let Your Student 'Do Hard Things."

From the writer, Karen Spierling:

"As a long-time college history professor — with a daughter beginning the college application process — this is my wish: That every first-year college student would come to campus with this mantra running through their head: College is hard. Learning is hard. I will work hard, and I can't wait to see what I learn!

"And that with every phone call or text with their college student, families would have this mantra running through their heads: You scream on the outside, I'll scream on the inside.

"In my own experience as a parent, when my children are overwhelmed by learning to do new and hard things, it takes all my concentration to stay calm and encouraging instead of shouting, 'Oh my gosh, you are right, that sounds impossible!'"

Doing hard things. That's part of school, that's part of college, that's part of life. And...it's part of discipleship.

It's hard to witness to the gospel of Jesus Christ. It's hard to serve other people in ways that Jesus would want us to serve. And sometimes it seems impossible or fruitless. And yet, it's not impossible.

With our own talents and skills, we can do the "hard things" of discipleship. And as a result, we can "make a joyful noise to the Lord" as the psalmist writes.

"Make a Joyful Noise" is our stewardship theme for this year. On Nov. 10, we will do that by committing our financial resources to the church's work in 2025. It's hard to let go of our money, money that we have worked hard for and saved diligently over many years in most cases.

And yet, in response to God's many blessings in our lives, we do the "hard thing" of letting go of some of our treasure so that others can be blessed. And in doing so, we will reap the reward of satisfaction that comes with serving our Lord.

Once again, from professor Karen Spierling: "What I know from my academic journey and what I see in my students is that hard is an essential element to satisfaction, accomplishment, pride, and growth. These are keys to our students' success in the adult world."

Giving is one of the hard things of faith. But it leads to satisfaction and to our growth as disciples.




