# FOR THE BEGINNING

Our Theme for Advent: "Words for the Beginning" From the creators of the Words for the Beginning series, Sanctified Art

Advent is a season of endings and beginnings. As the calendar year comes to a close, a new church year begins. Christ's birth ushers us into new ways of living and loving; and yet, the world as we know it spins madly on. In many ways, pregnant Mary was surrounded by endings—large and small, personal and political. But Mary proclaimed hope in a God who was and is making all things new. Christ's birth offered a beautiful new beginning for shepherds and Magi alike—all the while, King Herod tried to bring Christ's story to an end. When we ourselves navigate seasons filled with endings and beginnings, we need reminders. We need words that can feel like steady ground, like a path for our feet to find as we step forward into the unknown.

We have crafted an Advent series filled with blessings, with the words we need to hear again and again as we begin a new season. We imagined the words Mary would speak to her newborn son. What scriptures and stories would she impart to him? What lessons would she teach him as he grew? And so, our weekly themes may feel like the lessons we teach to children, but in reality, these are lessons we continue to learn and relearn as adults. They may sound like the messages we impart to loved ones during special ceremonies or sacred rituals. We intentionally selected scriptures that may be frequently used in weddings, ordination services, or baptisms. And so, we invite you to enter this Advent season as if you are entering a sacred new chapter, holding fast to the reminders that will bolster you for the journey ahead.

As you journey through this season, may you find words for belovedness and hope. May you find words for beginning again. For no matter what you are facing, no matter what this new day brings, love is your beginning.

Thank you to the Chancel Choir and the members of the Worship and Music Committee who worked to make our Sanctuary and Narthex look beautiful.



#### KARM Corners of Your Field

Corners of Your Field is a partnership between Knox Area Rescue Ministries (KARM) and local churches and nonprofit organizations, whereby members donate to KARM their gently used household items and clothing to be sold in the KARM stores. KARM returns back to the donating organization a portion of the value of each organizations donated items in the form of discount gift cards for use at KARM stores.

FPC participates in the program with many of our members making donations to the KARM stores. We receive the discounted gift cards, and then distribute them to local missions that benefit from receiving discounts on items purchased at KARM stores.

#### **Coats for the Cold**

KARM also sponsors Coats for the Cold program each year for the organizations that participate in the Corners of Your Field Program. Similar to the discount cards, KARM receives donations of gently used coats in November and December. KARM then provides coat vouchers to their member organizations for distribution to those in need, in this case at no charge for the coats.

Some of the missions that the FPC Outreach Committee provides with the discount cards and coat vouchers include Bridge Refugee Service, McNabb Center, Volunteer Ministry Center, Susannah's House, Restoration House and Safe Families.

In November, we distributed over \$500 in discount gift cards and 25 coat vouchers.



# Christmas Joy Offering December 22, 2024

Where have you seen hope recently?

We see hope in the faces of each of us gathered in worship. We feel hope through signs of mercy and grace shown to those in our communities during this busy season. We show hope through acts of loving kindness. We know of hope in the face of a child or an elder whom we love and trust. We trust in the hope of the Christ Child, for whom we prepare a way so he can prepare a way for us to know the fullness of God's love. There is hope all around us while we wait during this season of Advent.

Every year, the Christmas Joy Offering, one of the four churchwide Special Offerings of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), combines thousands of congregations' gifts to bring hope through

education and emergency assistance. Three Presbyterian-related schools that equip communities of color — Menaul School in Albuquerque, New Mexico; Presbyterian Pan American School in Kingsville, Texas; and Stillman College in Tuscaloosa, Alabama — provide a transformative education for students all around the globe. These jewels in the Presbyterian crown prepare the way for students from every walk of life to be active, compassionate and informed citizens of the world. Beyond their schoolwork, these students live together in a supportive intentional community where they prepare the way for one another through acts of generosity, mission and service. In their lives together, students experience the love of Christ that we all meet anew at Christmas.

Like the schools and colleges that equip communities of color, the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions prepares a way of peace and flourishing for church workers in times of financial crisis. This program provides lifegiving and critical assistance in the most tender moments of church workers' lives, like health or housing instability. The prophet Isaiah tells us that God is a bringer of comfort as we make the paths straight by offering food to the hungry and satisfying the needs of the afflicted. Jesus, the Light of the World, brings hope, so we can do just that through our receipt of the Christmas Joy Offering to support this vital assistance program.

Our gifts to the Christmas Joy Offering make all of this preparation possible. These gifts will combine with others from congregations throughout our denomination to do our part to repair the world and ensure that every person — whether they be a high schooler, college student or church worker — has the tools they need to flourish. Your gifts prepare the way for the God we know in Jesus Christ, the child whose birth we will celebrate soon. Thank you for all the ways that you give.

Advent is a time when we return to our roots as Christians. It is the first season of the liturgical year when we wait earnestly for Christ. Jesus was of humble beginnings, born in a stable in Bethlehem. The Advent candle lighting liturgies during our worship in Advent invite us to consider the humble beginnings of Jesus Christ, God's chosen ruler of peace and the light of the world, who brings God's hope.

For many centuries, the church has identified the beginning of the Christmas celebration with a time of reflection and expectation called Advent. The word Advent means "coming" or "arrival" and, when used in conjunction with Christmas, reminds us of the anticipation and expectation held over hundreds of years by the people of Israel for their Messiah and promised King. Today, one of the ways in which we mark Advent is with the display of a wreath - its circle reminds us of God himself, eternal and endlessly merciful. It is evergreen - reminding us of the hope of eternal life.

The four outer candles incorporated into the display represent the time of waiting and preparation for the Messiah during the four Sundays of Advent. The candles represent hope, peace, joy, and love. The light of the candles reminds us of the Light of world, and the prophetic promise of His coming. The white central candle of the Advent wreath, lit on Christmas Eve, reminds us of the fulfillment of His first Advent and the pure, humble means by which He came. The first Advent was the glorious manifestation of incarnation - the uniting of God and man in the person of Jesus of Nazareth, born of a virgin in a lowly stable in obscure Bethlehem Ephrata. This indeed was a magnificent and redeeming event without comparison!

One of the many wonderful things we always enjoy during the Advent and Christmas season is the music that enhances our celebration. Our Music Ministry is very proud to offer several opportunities to worship and celebrate together during the upcoming season. On Sunday, December 15 at 10:00 a.m. we will participate in our twenty-seventh annual Service of Lessons and Carols in the sanctuary. The Service of Lessons and Carols is a traditional seasonal service of scripture and music. It is a very special service celebrating the true meaning of the season. Come and sing the carols you love to sing, then be treated to a sumptuous reception!

On Christmas Eve, we will offer two 'evening' services. Our Casual Service will take place at 3:00 p.m. At 7:00 p.m., we will enjoy a beautifully-candlelit Traditional Service with a special prelude beginning at 6:50 p.m. by Dr. Linda Stutzenberger on her harp. If you love singing familiar carols during the season, come and join us in preparation for these special services.

Our music ministry here at FPC is for everyone who wishes to share their time and talents. Come make a joyful noise!!

We invite any little adventurers aged 3-9 to come aboard for a Sunday morning full of fun at 9:00am in our Fellowship Hall!


